Beginning July 15, families will be eligible to receive monthly child payments as part of the president's most recent relief package.

Qualified families will receive a payment of up to \$300 for each child up to 6 years of age, and up to \$250 monthly for children between the ages of 6 and 17. Nearly 88% of children are expected to qualify and receive benefits without any additional actions taken by their parents.

Couples earning \$150,000 or less can receive the full payment amounts via direct deposit from the IRS on the 15th of July. The benefits total \$3,600 annually for children under 6 and \$3,000 for those who are older. The IRS will determine eligibility based on the 2019 and 2020 tax years.

The president has proposed an extension of the increased child tax credit through 2025 as part of another relief plan.

Most importantly, his parents are the world to him and he shows his appreciation to mom and dad by snuggling his cheek to their cheeks.



Before his first birthday, Alexis was diagnosed with cerebral palsy. This diagnosis hasn't slowed Alexis down. He loves to be on the move and in the community.

Alexis' father, Abel, understands that some parents may ask "Why me?" but Abel looks past that question and sees the goodness in his and his wife's calling and they are truly grateful for their son. Abel believes the universe was aligning for his family before Alexis was born by calling him to Colorado 25 years ago. Unbeknownst to his family, Colorado is considered the gold standard for disability services and support, but those in this community know there is still a long way to go. These amazing Colorado services are where Abel and his family connected with PASCO. At PASCO, Abel's wife was able to be trained and paid in order to provide the most compassionate care to Alexis through the Family Caregiver Program and Abel himself provides backup services and support.

Abel can see the drastic improvement in the quality of life for his son Alexis and for his family. He continues to advocate for his son, and bring awareness to all those that he meets that Alexis may have special needs but he is one of the greatest gifts that has ever been bestowed on this earth.

Advocacy Corner by David Bolin

American Rescue Plan Act: The Department of Health Care Policy and Financing (HCPF) has posted a survey for input into how stakeholders think about the extra funding that is coming to the state for Home and Community Based Services (HCBS). The funding can only be used to expand, enhance or strengthen HCBS services. The link for the survey is: https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/CO-HCPF-ARPA. The deadline to submit your survey is July 4th. You can also email the department to give your input or send it to david@teamsvc.com and I will submit ideas to the department before their deadline.

You can view their slideshow at: <u>https://hcpf.colorado.gov/arpa</u>. Midway down the page, you will see "Materials: Slide Deck" that opens to their 30 slide deck. The advocacy team has provided Colorado Medicaid with suggestions of how to utilize the one-year additional federal matching funds for Home and Community Based Services (HCBS). We also provided the same list to the Joint Budget Committee. Last week, the Joint Budget Committee drafted the authorization to utilize the extra federal match for HCBS with Senate Bill 21-286. Here is the link to the bill: <u>http://leg.colorado.gov/bills/SB21-286</u>. We expect this bill will fly through the legislature before the session ends in June.

Nationally, the advocacy team is working with a national association to advocate for better funding for Home and Community Based Services and for greater access to these programs. President Biden has plans to expand funding for HCBS with significant funding over 5 years.

Colorado Legislature: The legislature is still in session with over 100 bills still to be considered over the next few weeks. Our next newsletter will have a list of bills that affect our clients, our services and all of our employees. By the next newsletter, we'll know what legislation passed and what bills the Governor signed.

For IHSS Consumer/Attendants: HCPF started using a Utilization Review/Utilization Management (URUM) vendor, Telligen, on March 1st to review all Prior Authorization Requests for Health Maintenance Activities (HMA). Some of you have been adversely affected due to the slowness of the system in place. Case management agencies may contact you to get additional documentation to support the need for HMA. Documentation could include more information from your physician, exercise plans, or other items to support HMA. Our IHSS and PAR team staff will help you gather the information requested to prevent service interruptions.

For Pediatric Home Health clients/CNAs: HCPF will start having their new URUM vendor for Home Health (KEPRO) review PAR requests in July or August. The start date has been a moving target for some time. There has been over a year delay in doing these reviews but HCPF believes they are about ready to start. PASCO has suggested ways to transition to these reviews so that not everyone's PAR will be reviewed right away. The Home Health Department and PAR Team are your go to contacts if you have questions.

HCPF develops Person Centered Planning for People with Disabilities: HCPF has developed an online 10 week course with the University of Colorado Colorado Springs for clients to receive training on conducting their own person centered planning sessions.
